A sourced comparison of three saved listings, the facts still missing, and the clearest next step.

Trailer B currently matches the fixed-bed, rainy-day seating, and dog-space priorities best. It earns the first verification visit, not an automatic purchase decision.

What could change it: The loaded tongue-weight basis, installed-option weight, slide-closed bathroom path, or a first-year quote above the buyer's ceiling.

Decision rule Advance Trailer B only if its missing weight inputs and travel-mode access can be verified. If either fails, keep Trailer C as the inspected fallback and pause Trailer A until its access questions are answered.

Current direction

Organize the inputs without inventing a verdict

Required boundary

Questions to resolve before choosing a finalist

- Please confirm the exact engine, axle ratio, receiver rating, tire ratings, and vehicle configuration.
- Please provide each trailer's certification and cargo-capacity labels for the exact unit.
- Which published hitch figures include batteries, propane, options, and dealer accessories?
- Can the finalist be weighed in realistic travel condition, including a tongue-weight measurement?

Evidence package to collect

Stop condition

If the exact configuration, labels, or material weight inputs cannot be obtained, keep the fact marked Missing and pause the decision rather than substituting a similar unit.

Compare the first-year decision, not just the sticker

Estimates stay labeled until quotes replace them. Financing, insurance, repair, and storage costs are never invented.

What this means

Trailer B is the floorplan leader but has almost no planning cushion. Replace tax, setup, insurance, storage, and out-the-door estimates with written quotes before changing the fixed ceiling.

Test the trailer in the family's real routine

Travel-day access, bad-weather use, sleeping setup, pets, storage, and setup complexity matter more than staged brochure photos.

What this means

Trailer B best supports the family's permanent-bed, rainy-day seating, and dog-space priorities. Travel-mode access remains an in-person requirement. Trailer C is the compact fallback if condition evidence is strong.

Tests to run in person

- Use the bathroom and open the refrigerator with every slide fully closed.
- Have both adults enter and leave the permanent bed without climbing over one another.
- Seat all three travelers while leaving a realistic place for the dog and shoes.
- Assign a storage home to food, bedding, outdoor gear, tools, and rainy-day clothing.

Replace assumptions with evidence

The best next action is the smallest one that can materially change the decision.

Trailer B Lakeview 24QB	1. Will the dealer demonstrate the bathroom and refrigerator path with the slide fully closed? 2. What is the exact as-optional cargo-capacity label value for this unit? 3. Can the out-the-door worksheet keep the first-year total below the buyer's fixed ceiling?
Trailer C Trailcrest 19DB	1. Will the seller allow an independent pre-purchase inspection before final acceptance? 2. Can the seller provide roof, seal, tire, bearing, water-intrusion, and appliance records? 3. What equipment and cargo were installed when any prior scale weights were recorded?

Recommended sequence

BEFORE A FINALIST	Email the label, travel-mode, installed-option, fee, and condition questions to all three sellers. Remove any unit whose seller will not provide basic evidence.
BEFORE A DEPOSIT	Visit Trailer B first and complete the slide-closed walkthrough. Keep the \$36,000 first-year ceiling fixed until written out-the-door and setup quotes replace the estimates.
BEFORE DELIVERY	Complete a unit-specific inspection, confirm labels and installed equipment, test every major system, document unresolved items in writing, and do not sign final acceptance until the agreed corrections are complete.

Evidence key
